Conductors

Elizabeth Berndt studied voice, piano and choral conducting under Ron Jeffers at Oregon State University and at the Conservatory of Music and Performing Arts in Stuttgart, Germany. She holds Bachelor's Degrees in Music and Music Education, with emphasis in Choral Conducting, and a Master's Degree in Education. She taught high school music for ten years, served as accompanist for the German American Choir and as rehearsal director for a 100 member symphonic choir. In the recent past she was artistic director and conductor of The Capstans men's chorus, was a board member of and performed with Olympia's Masterworks Choral Ensemble, and was past director of the Rose Garden Singers, a women's chorus performing in the Olympia region. Along with co-directing Women of Note, she is the artistic director and conductor of Harstine Island Community Choir.

Suzanne Montgomery is an elementary school music specialist for the Shelton School District. She received her Bachelor of Music Education from PLU in 1995 (cum laude) and her Master of Education degree from Lesley University in 2000. She has taught middle school strings and choir, as well as elementary general music in Tumwater and Las Vegas, Nevada. While in Nevada she served as accompanist and assistant director of the Southern Nevada Musical Arts Society. In 2002 and 2005 Suzanne traveled through Europe as organist and choir member with PLU's Choral Union. Her experience includes musical theatre and church music. She is the choir director and organist at both Faith Lutheran and St. David of Wales Episcopal in Shelton, and past artistic director of the Anna's Bay Chorale.
